

Entering the site from the ferry or bus stop we cross the city meadows, a place for a picnic, sport, family gatherings and walks, smoothly rising from the water towards the white and shining solar terraces. The south facing terraces are a place where locals can mix with tourists enjoying a lazy time, relaxing in the sun. This is a public area where theatre, lectures, workshops and other events are held.

Climbing the stairs we not only admire splendid view of the open sea and the city silhouette on the opposite site, but also get familiar with photovoltaic technology.

The top of the terraces is suspended over the verge of Copenhagen and the Baltic sea, a place of reflection on the human position in the surrounding environment.

This is a point of symbolic equilibrium and physical, structural balance

During the summer the terraces and meadows turn into an urban beach.

To chill and hide from the sun we can go underneath the terraces, where the wind moves the hanging triangular wings, giving a relief from the heat. We can cool down and swim in the open swimming pool, sunk into the ground on the north-east side of the site.

Plunged in the salt water of the swimming pool we admire the play of shadows and light peeping through the triangular openings in the terraces.

The structural changes in the sun play unpredictable tunes with the wind. This subtle mechanism is producing energy for the city.
