

## A PLACE FOR A CHOCOLATE ICE CREAM

The main access to the installation is located at the East of the plot and starts with a dense mass of modules that is decreasing West direction finishing up in an open green area towards the canal.

The modules are randomly localize over the grid so the position of the elements can be easily change without brake the network permitting create passages and different open/close space configurations depending of the actual program the installation is hosting.

The hexagonal grid configuration also gie the option of progressively construction of the project depending of the available resources and let the flexibility to conserves the possible foundations of the old buildings on the site by just reconfigurated the outline of the intervention area.
